CALLING CARDS WITH TINS

SUPPLIES

- Sakura Moonlight Pens
- Sakura Souffle Pen White
- Sakura Glaze Pens
- Black Cardstock
- Security Envelope
- Adhesive
- Tin
- Gesso
- Paintbrush

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Coat the top of your tin with a coat of gesso. This will cover up any logo or design and create a nice smooth surface for the pens to play on! Let the gesso dry completely.
2. Using red and pink Glaze pens, draw loose and scrolly circles with a curl inside.
3. Using green Glaze pens (there are two greens available) draw some simple pod shapes to represent leaves. These should be messy and free form!
4. Color the background of the lid with a blue Glaze pen.
5. Color in some of the flowers with a yellow Glaze Pen.
6. Add three black dots to every flower and leaf with a black Glaze pen.
7. Using a white Souffle pen draw two parallel lines lengthwise across the black cardstock (cut to fit inside your



tin). Write your blog address inbetween the lines.

8. Use the white Souffle pen to draw rows of dashed lines on the top of the card and scallops on the bottom of the card.
9. Color in the scallops with various colors of Moonlight pens.
10. Glue a piece of a security envelope (or patterned paper) to the back of your card for a pretty finish!
