## Framed Page

Frame your beautiful scrapbook pages and display them for everyone to see! This is the perfect way to showcase your works of "heart", especially the ones with embellishments.



### For this project you will need:

- Elmer's® Craftbond™ Glue Spots – Medium
- Elmer's® Craftbond™ Extra Strength Glue Stick
- Elmer's® Craftbond™ Clear Glue Pen
- Elmer's® Craftbond™ Tape Runner - Permanent
- Elmer's® Self Stick Foam Board

Elmer's® Painter - Silver  
X-ACTO® Craft Knife  
X-ACTO® Metal Ruler  
X-ACTO® Self Heal Craft Mat  
X-ACTO® 12" Rotary Trimmer  
X-ACTO® Precision Scissors  
12" x 12" Patterned Paper  
12" x 12" Cardstock - Burgundy (or other complimentary color)  
8 ½" x 11" Silver Mirri Card (a shiny silver cardstock)  
2 Blumenthal Lansing "Favorite Findings" White & Pink Clear glitter buttons  
15" of 2 ½" Wide Silver Ribbon  
White Tulle  
8" Ecu lace  
Chipboard Letter  
2 Silver Chenille Stems  
5" x 7" Photograph  
Silk Flowers  
**Optional:** Square Frame

1. Trim the background paper to 10" x 10" (or size of frame) using the rotary trimmer.
2. Use the craft knife and metal ruler to cut a 5" x 7" and a 10" x 10" piece of self stick foam board. Remove the backing paper to expose the adhesive then adhere the paper and the photograph to each of the foam board pieces.
3. Cut a 2 ¾" x 10" strip from the cardstock. Cut the silver mirri card ½" wider and longer than the photograph.
4. Paint the chipboard letter silver with the Painter including the edges.
5. **Tip:** You can use individual, or packaged flowers, but I used the flowers from a silk flower bush purchased in the floral dept of the craft store. Remove the stem and the center piece then re-assemble the petals. Fold a 1" piece of chenille into a "U" shape then poke the ends through the holes in a button then thru the center of the circles of petals. Bend the ends back. **Tip:** For extra texture, pinch a piece of tulle at the center then place this on top of the button. Trim ends as needed. You will need two flowers, one a little smaller than the other.
6. Bend the chenille stem in half then curl each end around the pen.

**To assemble, glue:**

1. The strip of burgundy cardstock across the foam board page about 1 ¼" from the bottom using the tape runner.
2. The silver ribbon across the center of the cardstock strip. Secure the ends to the back of the foam board with glue spots.
3. The photograph to the center of the silver mirri card with the glue stick then adhere to the page with the glue pen as shown.
4. The lace across the mirri card at the base of the photo with the glue pen. Use the small end to apply a thin line.
5. The chipboard letter and the flowers in place as shown then glue the end of the chenille stem between the ribbon and the cardstock behind the flower.
6. 10" 10" square of cardstock to the back of the foam board to finish. Display on a decorative easel, or place in a frame.
