

Supplies:

- 12x12 Watercolor Paper
- Sakura Koi Coloring Brush Markers
- Paintbrush
- Jar or container of water
- Adhesive backed fun foam
- Thick fun foam
- Scissors
- Marker
- Ruler
- Acrylic Paint: dark blue, white, light blue
- Palette Paper
- Brayer
- Rolling Dot Stamp
- Baby Wipes
- Balzer Designs/Crafter's Workshop "Tiny Circles" stencil
- Cosmetic sponge
- Archival Ink
- Text Stamp
- Small paper cup
- Brother ScanNCut
- DCWV Violet Leaf Stack
- DCWV Foiled Cardstock Stack
- 2.25x3" photograph
- Adhesive
- Typed Journaling

Instructions:

- Choose 3-4 colors of the Koi Coloring Brush Markers that are similar. I used 2 greens and 2 blues. Randomly color with them on the watercolor paper.
- 2. Use a wet paintbrush to blend the colors and spread them

across the paper. You can tip the paper to let the color drip.

- 3. Add more color with the markers, as desired. It's fine to work into the wet paper.
- 4. Let dry or dry with a heat gun.
- 5. Make your own foam stamp.
 - a. Cut a 1-inch strip of thick fun foam. This will be the base of your stamp.
 - b. Cut a 1-inch strip of adhesive backed fun foam.
 - c. Cut the adhesive backed foam into small pieces.
 - d. Remove the backing on the adhesive backed foam and adhere the pieces to the thick fun foam.
 - e. Trim any excess adhesive backed foam away.
- Brayer some acrylic paint out onto a piece of palette paper. Use it to "ink" up your foam stamp. Stamp onto the layout.
- 7. Use the paint to also stamp with

a rolling dot stamp.

- 8. Clean both stamps and the brayer with baby wipes right away.
- 9. Add some circles with the Balzer Designs "Tiny Circles" stencil. Use acrylic paint and a cosmetic sponge and dab up and down through the stencil.
- 10. Use black Archival Ink to stamp portions of a text stamp throughout the background.
- 11. Use a small paper cup as a stamp to create circles on the layout's background.
- 12. Let dry or dry with a heat gun.
- Arrange your title on top of the basic bracket shape (from the Brother ScanNCut built-in designs). The bracket shape should be slightly larger than your photo. Mine is just under 5" wide.
- 14. Cut the layered design from a piece of patterned paper from the DCWV Violet Leaf Stack.
- 15. Delete the title and cut just the bracket shape from a piece of paper from the DCWV Foiled Cardstock Stack.
- 16. Adhere the two cut pieces together.
- 17. Adhere the bracket shape to the layout.
- 18. Adhere the photograph above the title.
- 19. Adhere your journaling to the right corner of the photo.
